Day 1, Sunday, January 08, 2017 - Depart USA

Depart USA on your transatlantic flight to Tel Aviv, Israel, with dinner and breakfast served en route.

Day 2, Monday, January 09, 2017 - Arrive in Israel, Jaffa.

Overnight in Netanya.

Arrive in Israel. Visit the old city of Jaffa where Simon the Tanner lived and from where Peter left to bring the gospel to Cornelius. (Acts 9, 10). Overnight in Netanya.

Day 3, Tuesday, January 10, 2017 - Caesarea, Mt. Carmel, Megiddo, Mt. Precipice. Overnight in Galilee.

Proceed northward along the coast of the Mediterranean Sea to Caesarea, a center of the early Christians, where you will visit the Roman Aqueduct and Theatre. Above the city of Haifa is Mt. Carmel, where Elijah defeated the Baal prophets. You'll visit the monastery at the top of the mountain. Travel to Megiddo (Biblical Armageddon), where 20 different cities lie superimposed upon each other. In Nazareth, visit Mt. Precipice where Jesus was rejected by those in the synagogue after He taught them. Overnight in the Galilee area.

Day 4, Wednesday, January 11, 2017 - Jesus Boat, Galilee Boat Ride, Arbel Cliffs, Migdal, Capernaum, Mt. of Beatitudes, Peter's Primacy, Tabkha. Overnight in Galilee.

Begin your morning with a visit to Nof Ginnosour to see the ancient boat dating to the time of Christ. Continue with a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee. Travel to Mt. Arbel to view the Sea of Galilee and the area where Jesus ministered. Explore the recently discovered archeological site at Migdal (Magdala). Explore Capernaum, the center of Jesus' ministry in the Galilean region. Visit the synagogue, which stands on the site where Jesus taught. Recall His teaching and preaching the gospel of the kingdom. Visit the peaceful Mt. of Beatitudes. On this hill, Jesus preached the Sermon on the Mount. Stop at the Chapel of the Primacy where Peter confessed his devotion to Christ 3 times (John 21). Continue to Tabkha, the traditional location for the calling of the disciples and the feeding of the 5,000 and visit the Church of the Fish and the Loaves (Luke 9:10-17). Overnight in the Galilee area.

Day 5, Thursday, January 12, 2017 - Tel Dan, Caesarea Philippi, Golan Heights (including Peace Vista and Mt. Bental), Korazin, Bethsaida (time permitting), Kursi (time permitting). Overnight in Galilee.

This morning travel to Tel Dan where you can see the ancient city gates from the time of Abraham. Proceed to Baniyas (Caesarea Philippi) where Peter confessed that Jesus was the Christ. Enjoy a lush stroll through the beautiful nature preserve. Continue to the Golan Heights for a spectacular view from the Peace Vista of the Sea of Galilee. Visit Peace Vista. Continue to Mt. Bental to see the military installation there. Visit Korazin, one of the towns cursed by Jesus for failing to heed His message. Walk the streets of Bethsaida (time permitting), one of the "cities of woe" mentioned by Jesus in

Matthew 11 and where Jesus chose five of his disciples (Matt. 4:18-21; John 1:39-51). Return to the Sea of Galilee area to visit Kursi (time permitting), the likely area where Christ cast the demons into the herd of swine. Overnight in the Galilee area.

Day 6, Friday, January 13, 2017 - Tzippori, Nazareth (drive through), Beit Shean, Qsar al Yahud, Qumran, Wadi Qelt, Jerusalem-Mt. Scopus view. Overnight in Jerusalem area.

Visit the ancient ruins of Tzippori, the cosmopolitan Roman capital of Galilee which is heralded as the birthplace of Mary. Joseph could have worked on the construction of this city when it was being built. Drive through Nazareth on your way to Beit Shean, which has been occupied for over 5,000 years and view the country's best preserved Roman amphitheatre and other impressive Roman city remains. Visit Qsar al Yahud, the traditional site of the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist (John 1). Proceed to Qumran to view the site where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered and the area that was inhabited by the mysterious community of the Essenes. View Wadi Qelt and the Road to Jericho. Have your first view of the Old City of Jerusalem from Mt. Scopus. Overnight in Jerusalem area.

Day 7, Saturday, January 14, 2017 - Biblical Gardens at Yad Hashmona, Shabbat services with local believers, Sorek Valley/Beit Shemesh, Road to Emmaus, Ayalon Valley, Elah Valley. Overnight in Jerusalem area.

Learn Biblical customs at the Yad Hashmona Biblical Gardens. Worship at the Shabbat services with Jewish believers. Continue to Beit Shemesh, where the Ark was returned to the Israelites by the Philistines. See the Sorek Valley, home of Samson and Delilah. Journey into the Old Testament as you visit the Valley of Ayalon where the sun stood still as Joshua defeated the Amorites. Walk the Road to Emmaus where Jesus met two disciples after His resurrection. Remember David's victory over Goliath in the Valley of Elah. Overnight in the Jerusalem area.

Day 8, Sunday, January 15, 2017 - Knesset, Second Temple Model, Shrine of the Book, Yad Vashem. Overnight at Dead Sea.

View the Knesset, Israel's Parliament. Visit the Israel Museum to see the Second Temple Model of Jerusalem and the Shrine of the Book where you can see the fragments of the Dead Sea Scrolls. This afternoon visit Yad Vashem Holocaust Memorial and be touched by its poignant images. Overnight in the Dead Sea area.

Day 9, Monday, January 16, 2017 - Ein Gedi, Masada, Arad (time permitting), Beer Sheva. Overnight in Jerusalem area.

Journey to Ein Gedi and visit the nature preserve and waterfall. Ride the cable car to the top to explore Masada, Herod's mountaintop fortress, which became the last stronghold of the Jewish revolt against the Romans. Peer down upon the remains of the Roman camps and siege ramp. Travel to Arad (time permitting), mentioned only four times in the Bible, yet an important city in biblical times. The

most remarkable discovery in Arad is the only Israelite temple yet excavated. Its plan appears to follow that of Solomon's temple. Visit Beer Sheva, where Abraham made a pact with Abimelech (Genesis 21). Overnight in the Jerusalem area.

Day 10, Tuesday, January 17, 2017 - Temple Mount, Pool of Bethesda, City of David, Hezekiah's Tunnel, Pool of Siloam, New Drainage Tunnel, Southern Steps/Davidson Center. Overnight in Jerusalem area.

Visit the Temple Mount to view the site of the Jewish Temple. Continue to the Pool of Bethesda where Christ healed the lame man. Outside of the city walls, visit the City of David where you see the Gihon Spring, Hezekiah's Tunnel and the Pool of Siloam. Have a partial view of the new Drainage Tunnel. Visit the Southern Steps of the Temple, the same steps that Christ would have used to enter the Temple. Learn about present and past excavation work at the Davidson Center including the virtual tour. Overnight in Jerusalem.



Day 11, Wednesday, January 18, 2017 - Emeq Tsurim, Temple Institute, Western Wall, Western Wall Tunnel, Antonia Fortress, Lithostratus, Jewish Quarter. Overnight in Jerusalem area.

Start your day with a visit to Emeq Tsurim, the archaeological site where excavations from under the Temple Mount are being studied. Visit the Temple Institute to learn of the ordinances and ceremonies of the Temple. Enter the Old City and touch a piece of the Temple when you pray at the Western Wall. Visit underground Jerusalem when you walk through the Western Wall Tunnel. Continue to the Lithostratus to see the remains of the Antonia Fortress where Pilate tried Jesus. Walk the Jewish Quarter and take time to visit the Cardo, a 2,000 year-old market with shops old and new. Overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 12, Thursday, January 19, 2017 - Mt. of Olives, Dominus Flevit, Garden of Gethsemane, Caiaphas' House, David's Tomb, Upper Room, Shepherds' Fields, Garden Tomb. Depart for Tel Aviv for flight home.

Recount the final hours of Jesus before His crucifixion by walking from the top of the Mt. of Olives down to the Garden of Gethsemane where He prayed and was apprehended. At Dominus Flevit church, visit the place where Jesus mourned for Jerusalem. See the house of the High Priest Caiaphas where Christ was imprisoned and Peter denied Him. Visit the site of King David's Tomb. On Mt. Zion, see the Upper Room where Jesus had a final meal with his disciples. Enjoy a view of the Shepherds' Fields. Finally, visit the Garden Tomb where Christ was buried and see the empty tomb because He is arisen! Transfer to the Tel Aviv airport for your flight home

Day 13, Friday, January 20, 2017 - Arrive in the USA.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

Price is based on double occupancy. When available, single rooms are often smaller than doubles. While EOT will try to match roommates, EOT cannot guarantee a roommate will be available. Roommates may be assigned as late as 35 days prior to departure and, if one is not available or you request a single room, the following charge applies: \$698.

PAYMENT:

A full deposit of \$500 per person is due 03/15/2016, 2nd deposit of \$500 is due 05/15/2016, 3rd deposit of \$500 and full travel protection premium is due 07/15/2016. Optional travel protection premiums must be paid in addition to initial or third deposit prior to the final payment for coverage to be in effect. Final payment for trip is due 10/15/2016. All prices reflect a 4% discount for full payment via cash or check. Consequently, if the final payment is not made by check or cash, the balance will be 4% higher than the cash discounted price on the front of the brochure. Thereafter, a late payment fee of \$100 will be assessed. After final payment date, new registrants may incur significantly higher fees.

REGISTRATIONS RECEIVED 105 DAYS PRIOR TO DEPARTURE OR LESS:

We welcome registrations after 09/25/2016. Registrations received after this date will incur an additional fee based on air availability. Additional fees will be advised upon registration.

CANCELLATION FEES:

100% of cancellation fees are covered by the optional Travel Protection Program, provided premium has been paid and reason for cancellation is insurable. All deposit due dates and payment dates are noted on page four of this brochure. The cancellation fees include the following penalties: The first deposit payment is due on March 15, 2016 and is fully refundable up until the second deposit date of May 15, 2016. There are no penalties for cancellation prior to May 15, 2016. From May 15, 2016 through to 60 days prior to the departure date, the cancellation penalty is 50% of the total deposit payments due (even if this amount exceeds the deposit payments actually made) by the date of the cancellation. The cancellation penalty for cancellation at any time beginning 30 days prior to departure and running through the dates of the trip is 100% of the total cost of the trip. In addition to the penalties described above (and irrespective of the date of cancellation), the cancellation fees will also include any airline penalties imposed, and a single room supplement if cancellation forces another traveler on the trip to be the sole occupant of a hotel room on the trip. Notice of cancellation must be submitted in writing.

PRICE INCREASES:

All prices quoted in this brochure are subject to change prior to payment in full due to currency fluctuations, fuel surcharge increases, government taxes and fees increases or unforeseen circumstances. In addition, you may be subject to a price increase after payment in full has been received due to potential government imposed taxes and fees.

AIRLINE ROUTES AND TICKETS:
