



Greece & Israel Holy Land Tour

Day 1 - May 23 – Depart USA

Depart USA on your transatlantic flight to Athens with dinner and breakfast served en route.

Day 2 - May 24 – Arrive in Athens

Arrive in Athens where your guide will greet you and escort you to your bus for a driving tour of the city. See the **House of Parliament**, the **Presidential Palace** and the **Tomb of the Unknown Soldier**. Transfer to your hotel in Athens for dinner and overnight.

Day 3 - May 25 – Athens and Corinth

Enjoy the rich architectural splendor of the ancient city of **Athens** as your guide introduces you to the world renowned **Acropolis**, the **Propylaea**, the **Parthenon** and the **Erectheum**. Stand on **Mars Hill** as the apostle Paul did when he proclaimed, "I found an altar with this inscription, TO THE UNKNOWN GOD. Whom therefore ye ignorantly worship, him declare I unto you" (Acts 17:23). Then travel to the city of **Corinth**, where the apostle Paul met fellow tentmakers Aquila and Priscilla and received a vision from the Lord saying, "I am with thee, and no man shall set on thee to hurt thee: for I have much people in this city" (Acts 18:10). As Paul spoke, Crispus (chief ruler of the synagogue) and many others believed and were baptized (Acts 18:8), establishing the church at Corinth to whom Paul later wrote his two epistles. Discover the **Archaeological Museum**, **Market Place** and **Temples**. As you walk among the ruins, stand on the **Bema** where the apostle Paul stood before Gallio to face charges brought against him by the Jews. Stop briefly at the port town of **Cenchreae** from which Paul later departed for Syria (Acts 18:12-18). Return to **Athens** for dinner and overnight.

Day 4 - May 26 – Flight from Greece to Israel. Arrival in Israel, Jaffa, Caesarea

In the morning, you'll transfer to the airport to fly to Israel. Arrive in Tel Aviv where you will be met by your guide. Visit the old city of **Jaffa** where Simon the Tanner lived and from where Peter left to bring the gospel to Cornelius (Acts 9, 10). Proceed northward along the coast of the Mediterranean Sea to **Caesarea**, a center of the early Christians where you will visit the Roman Aqueduct and Theatre. Check in for dinner and overnight in Netanya.

Day 5 - May 27 – Mt. Carmel, Megiddo, Mt. Precipice, Capernaum, Arbel Cliffs

Visit **Mt. Carmel** where Elijah defeated the Baal prophets and the monastery at the top of the mountain. Continue to **Megiddo** (Biblical Armageddon) where 20 different cities lie superimposed upon each other. In **Nazareth** visit **Mt. Precipice** where Jesus was rejected by those in the synagogue after He taught them. Explore **Capernaum**, the center of Jesus' ministry in the Galileean region. Visit the synagogue, which stands on the site where Jesus taught. Recall His teaching and preaching the gospel of the kingdom. Travel to **Mt. Arbel** and walk along its peak for a stunning view of the **Sea of Galilee** with extended views of **Mt. Hermon** in the north and **Mt. Tabor** in the south. Check into your Galilee hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 6 - May 28 – Tel Dan, Caesarea Philippi, Jesus Boat and Galilee Boat Ride, Mt. of Beatitudes, Tabgha

Visit **Tel Dan** where you can see the ancient city gates from the time of Abraham. Travel to **Banias** (Caesarea Philippi) where Peter confessed that Jesus was the Christ. Enjoy a lush stroll through the beautiful nature preserve. Return to the Sea of Galilee and visit **Nof Ginosar** to see the ancient boat dating to the time of Christ. Continue with a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee. Visit the peaceful **Mt. of Beatitudes**. On this hill, Jesus preached the Sermon on the Mount. At **Tabgha**, the traditional location for the calling of the disciples and the feeding of the 5,000, visit the Church of the Fish and the Loaves (Luke 9:10-17). Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 7 - May 29 – Harod Spring, Ahab's Palace, Kasr El Yehud, Beit Shean, Qumran

Next visit **Gideon's Spring** (Ein Harod) where Gideon chose his army of 300 by observing how they drank from the springs (Jd. 7). Visit **Ahab's Palace** decorated with ivory plaques. Continue to Beit Shean, which has been occupied for over 5,000 years and view the country's best-preserved Roman amphitheater and other impressive Roman city remains. Visit the baptismal site at **Kasr el Yehud** where many believe that Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist (John 1). Proceed to **Qumran** to view the site where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered and the area that was inhabited by the mysterious community of the Essenes. Check into your Dead Sea hotel for dinner and overnight.

**Day 8 - May 30 – Ein Gedi, Masada, Wadi Qelt, Jerusalem–
Mt. Scopus View**

Journey to **Ein Gedi** and visit the nature preserve and waterfall where David hid from Saul. Travel to **Masada**, Herod's mountaintop fortress, which became the last stronghold of the Jewish revolt against the Romans. Ride the cable car to the top to explore. Peer down upon the remains of the Roman camps and siege ramp. Begin your ascent to **Jerusalem** by viewing **Wadi Qelt** and the Road to Jericho. Arriving in Jerusalem you'll have your first view of the Old City from **Mt. Scopus**. Check into your Jerusalem hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 9 - May 31 – Second Temple Model of Jerusalem, Shrine of the Book, Yad Vashem, Shepherds' Fields, Sorek Valley/Beit Shemesh, Road to Emmaus, Ayalon Valley, Elah Valley, Biblical Gardens at Yad Hashmonah

You'll visit **Israel Museum** where you can see the Second Temple Model of ancient Jerusalem and the Shrine of the Book. Visit **Yad Vashem** Holocaust Museum and be touched by its poignant images. View the **Shepherds' Fields**. Continue to **Sorek Valley** known as the meeting place for Samson and Delilah and where he was eventually captured by the Philistines. Visit **Beit Shemesh**, an ancient biblical site known for its recent digs. View the Road to **Emmaus** where Jesus, after His resurrection, met two of His disciples who did not recognize Him until He later broke bread with them in their home. Travel to the ancient city of **Ayalon**, located in the Valley of Ayalon where Joshua defeated the five Ammonite kings. Continue your journey through the **Valley of Elah** where David defeated Goliath (I Samuel 17). Travel to **Yad Hashmonah** and learn Biblical customs at the Yad Hashmonah **Biblical Gardens**. Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 10 - June 1 – Mt. of Olives, Dominus Fleuit, Garden of Gethsemane, Caiaphas' House, Upper Room, David's Tomb, Garden Tomb

Recount the final hours of Jesus before His crucifixion by walking from the top of the **Mt. of Olives** down to the **Garden of Gethsemane** where He prayed and was apprehended. At **Dominus Fleuit** church, visit the place where Jesus mourned for Jerusalem. See the house of the **High Priest Caiaphas** where Christ was imprisoned and Peter denied Him. On **Mt. Zion**, see the **Upper Room** where Jesus had a final meal with his disciples. See King David's Tomb nearby. Finally, visit the **Garden Tomb** where Christ was buried and see the empty tomb because He is arisen! Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight.



Day 11 - June 2 – Western Wall, Western Wall Tunnel, Antonia Fortress, Lithostratos, Church of the Holy Sepulcher, Jewish Quarter, Cardo, Old Wall, Temple Institute

Enter the Old City and touch a piece of the Temple when you pray at the **Western Wall**. Visit underground Jerusalem when you walk through the **Western Wall Tunnel**. Continue to the **Lithostratos** to see the remains of the **Antonia Fortress** where Pilate tried Jesus. Visit the Church of the **Holy Sepulcher**. Walk the Jewish Quarter and take time to visit the **Cardo**, a 2,000 year-old-market with shops old and new. View the portion of the Old Wall built by Hezekiah. Visit the **Temple Institute** to learn of the ordinances and ceremonies of the Temple. Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 12 - June 3 – Temple Mount, Pool of Bethesda, City of David, Hezekiah's Tunnel, Pool of Siloam, New Drainage Tunnel, Southern Steps, Davidson Center

Visit the **Temple Mount** to view the site of the Jewish Temple. Continue to the **Pool of Bethesda** where Christ healed the lame man. Outside of the city walls, visit the **City of David** where you see the **Gihon Spring**, **Hezekiah's Tunnel** and the **Pool of Siloam**. Also have a partial view of the new Drainage Tunnel. Visit the **Southern Steps** of the Temple, the same steps that Christ would have used to enter the Temple. Learn about present and past excavation work at the **Davidson Center** including the virtual tour. Prepare for your return flights.

Day 13 - June 4 – Return Home

Return home with memories of the people and places of the Bible.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

Price is per person based on double occupancy. When available, single rooms are often smaller than doubles. While EOT will try to match roommates, EOT cannot guarantee a roommate will be available. Roommates may be assigned as late as 30 days prior to departure and, if one is not available or you request a single room, the following charges apply: \$898 during the basic tour.

PAYMENT SCHEDULE:

A full deposit of \$500 per person is due 07/30/17, 2nd deposit of \$500 is due 09/30/17, 3rd deposit of \$500 and full travel protection premium is due 11/30/17. Optional travel protection premiums must be paid in addition to initial or third deposit prior to the final payment for coverage to be in effect. Final payment for trip is due 02/15/18. All prices reflect a 4% discount for full payment via cash or check. Consequently, if the final payment is not made by check or cash, the balance will be 4% higher than the cash discounted price on the front of the brochure. Thereafter, a late payment fee of \$100 will be assessed. After final payment date, new registrants may incur significantly higher fees.

REGISTRATIONS RECEIVED after February 15, 2018:

We welcome registrations after 02/15/18. Registrations received after this date will incur an additional fee based on air availability. Additional fees will be advised upon registration.

CANCELLATION FEES:

100% of cancellation fees are covered by the optional Travel Protection Program, provided premium has been paid and reason for cancellation is coverable. All deposit due dates and payment dates are noted on page four of this brochure. The cancellation fees include the following penalties: The first deposit payment is due on July 30, 2017 and is fully refundable up until the second deposit date of September 30, 2017. There are no penalties for cancellation prior to September 30, 2017. From September 30, 2017 through to 60 days prior to the departure date, the cancellation penalty is 50% of the total deposit payments due (even if this amount exceeds the deposit payments actually made) by the date of the cancellation. The cancellation penalty for cancellation at any time beginning 30 days prior to departure and running through the dates of the trip is 100% of the total cost of the trip. In addition to the penalties described above (and irrespective of the date of cancellation), the cancellation fees will also include any airline penalties imposed, and a single room supplement if cancellation forces another traveler on the trip to be the sole occupant of a hotel room on the trip. Notice of cancellation must be submitted in writing.

FIT TO TRAVEL STATEMENT:

Passengers registering for the tour accept the responsibility for being in good health and able to walk and travel on the tour. Because many of the sites are not accessible to the physically challenged, those needing oxygen, wheelchairs, or other ambulatory assistance will find the tour extremely limiting to their experiences. PASSPORT INFORMATION, CONFIRMATION OF ITINERARY & CHECK IN PROCESS:

Passport information must be submitted to our office no later than 02/15/18. Failure to provide your passport information to our office by this date may result in change fees or denial of travel. Approximately 105 days prior to your trip you will be contacted to re-confirm your itinerary, travel arrangements and registration information during the preliminary check in process for your trip. Discrepancies in information or failure to check in for your tour may result in change fees, delays in receiving travel documents for your trip, or denial of travel.

PRICE INCREASES:

All prices quoted in this brochure are subject to change prior to payment in full due to currency fluctuations, fuel surcharge increases, government taxes and fees increases or unforeseen circumstances. In addition, you may be subject to a price increase after payment in full has been received due to potential government imposed taxes and fees.

AIRLINE ROUTES and TICKETS:

In order to keep prices low, EOT does not guarantee the most direct routing to your final destination. Once "printed", airline tickets cannot be changed or refunded thereafter. Air transportation to/from your destination will be economy class on IATA and ARC carriers utilizing APEX or SUPER APEX non-refundable, non-amendable tickets for groups of 10 or more flying together on entire itinerary. If you choose to depart from a different city than your group or travelling companion, or deviate your flight and/or trip plans, and/or you are taking a pre or post tour, you may fly on a different scheduled flight(s) than the rest of your group.
