Day 1 – Thursday, May 26: Depart USA

Depart USA on your transatlantic flight to Rome, Italy, with dinner and breakfast served en route.

Day 2 - Friday, May 27: Arrive in Italy

Day 5 – Monday, May 30: Flight from Italy to Israel. Arrival in Israel, Jaffa, Caesarea

In the morning, transfer to the airport to fly from Italy to Israel. Arrive in Tel Aviv, where you will be met by our representative. Visit the old city of Jaffa, where Simon the Tanner lived and from where Peter left to bring the gospel to Cornelius (Acts 9, 10). Proceed northward along the coast of the Mediterranean Sea to Caesarea, a center of the early Christians, where you will visit the Roman Aqueduct and Theatre. Overnight in Netanya.

Day 6 – Tuesday, May 31: Mt. Carmel, Megiddo, Mt. Precipice, Capernaum, Arbel Cliffs

Visit Mt. Carmel, where Elijah defeated the Baal prophets and the monastery at the top of the mountain. Continue to Megiddo (Biblical Armageddon), where 20 different cities lie superimposed upon each other. In Nazareth visit the Mt. of Precipice where Jesus was rejected by those in the synagogue after He taught them. Explore Capernaum, the center of Jesus' ministry in the Galilean region. Visit the synagogue, which stands on the site where Jesus taught. Recall His teaching and preaching the gospel of the kingdom. Travel to Mt. Arbel and walk along its peak for a stunning view of the Sea of Galilee with extended views of Mt. Hermon in the north and Mt. Tabor in the south. Overnight in the Galilee.

Day 7 – Wednesday, June 1: Tel Dan, Caesarea Philippi, Jesus Boat and Galilee Boat Ride, Mt of Beatitudes, Tabkha

Visit Tel Dan, where you can see the ancient city gates from the time of Abraham. Travel to Banias (Caesarea Philippi), where Peter confessed that Jesus was the Christ. Enjoy a lush stroll through the beautiful nature preserve. Return to the Sea of Galilee and visit Nof Ginosar to see the ancient boat dating to the time of Christ. Continue with a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee. Visit the peaceful Mount of Beatitudes. On this hill, Jesus preached the Sermon on the Mount. At Tabkha, the traditional location for the calling of the disciples and the feeding of the 5,000, visit the Church of the Loaves and Fish (Luke 9:10-17). Overnight in the Galilee.

Day 8 – Thursday, June 2: Yardenit, Harod Spring, Ahab's Palace, Beit Shean, Qumran

At the Yardenit Baptismal site, situated where the Jordan River flows out of the Sea of Galilee on its way to the Dead Sea, enjoy the peace and tranquility of the natural surroundings of the river in which Christ was baptized by John the Baptist (Mark 1:9-11). Next, visit Gideon's Spring (Ein Harod), where Gideon chose his army of 300 by observing how they drank from the springs (Judges 7). Visit Ahab's Palace decorated with ivory plaques. Continue to Beit Shean, which has been occupied for over 5,000 years, and view the country's best-preserved Roman amphitheater and other impressive Roman city remains. Proceed to Qumran to view the site where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered and the area that was inhabited by the mysterious community of the Essenes. Overnight at the Dead Sea area.

Day 9 – Friday, June 3: Ein Gedi, Masada, Wadi Qelt, Jerusalem – Mt. Scopus View

Journey to Ein Gedi and visit the nature preserve and waterfall where David hid from Saul. Travel to Masada, Herod's mountaintop fortress, which became the last stronghold of the Jewish revolt against the Romans. Ride the cable car to the top to explore. Peer down upon the remains of the Roman camps and siege ramp. Begin your ascent to Jerusalem by viewing Wadi Qelt and the Road to Jericho. Arriving in Jerusalem, have your first view of the Old City from Mt. Scopus. Overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 10 – Saturday, June 4: Israel Museum, Yad Vashem, Shepherds' Fields, Sorek Valley/Beit Shemesh, Road to Emmaus, Elah Valley, Biblical Gardens at Yad Hashmona

Visit the Israel Museum, where you can see the Second Temple Model of ancient Jerusalem and the Shrine of the Book. Visit Yad Vashem and be touched by its poignant images. View the Shepherds' Fields. Continue to Sorek Valley known as the meeting place for Samson and Delilah and where he was eventually captured by the Philistines. Visit Beit Shemesh, an ancient biblical site known for its recent digs. View the road to Emmaus, where Jesus, after His resurrection, met two of His disciples who did not recognize Him until He later broke bread with them in their home. Journey through the Valley of Elah where David defeated Goliath (I Samuel 17). Travel to Yad Hashmona and learn Biblical customs at the Yad Hashmona Biblical Gardens. Overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 11 – Sunday, June 5: Mt. of Olives, Dominus Flevit, Garden of Gethsemane, Caiaphas' House, David's Tomb, Upper Room, Garden Tomb

Recount the final hours of Jesus before His crucifixion by walking from the top of the Mt. of Olives down to the Garden of Gethsemane where He prayed and was apprehended. At Dominus Flevit church, visit the place where Jesus mourned for Jerusalem. See the house of the High Priest Caiaphas where Christ was imprisoned and Peter denied Him. See King David's Tomb nearby. On Mt. Zion, see the Upper Room where Jesus had a final meal with his disciples. Finally, visit the Garden Tomb where Christ was buried and see the empty tomb because He is arisen! Overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 12 – Monday, June 6: Western Wall, Western Wall Tunnel, Antonia Fortress, Lithostratus, Church of the Holy Sepulcher, Jewish Quarter, Cardo, Old Wall, Temple Institute

Enter the Old City and touch a piece of the Temple when you pray at the Western Wall. Visit underground Jerusalem when you walk through the Western Wall Tunnel. Continue to the Lithostratos to see the remains of the Antonia Fortress where Pilate tried Jesus. Visit the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. Walk the Jewish Quarter and take time to visit the Cardo, a 2,000-year-old market with shops old and new. View the portion of the Old Wall built by Hezekiah. Visit the Temple Institute to learn of the ordinances and ceremonies of the Temple. Overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 13 – Tuesday, June 7: Temple Mount, Pool of Bethesda, City of David, Hezekiah's Tunnel, Pool of Siloam, Southern Steps, Davidson Center

Visit the Temple Mount to view the site of the Jewish Temple. Continue to the Pool of Bethesda where Christ healed the lame man. Outside of the city walls, visit the City of David where you see the Gihon Spring, Hezekiah's Tunnel and the Pool of Siloam. Visit the Southern Steps of the Temple, the same steps that Christ would have used to enter the Temple. Learn about present and past excavation work at the Davidson Center. Transfer to the airport.

Day 14 – Wednesday, June 8: Return to the USA or enjoy an Extension Depart for USA with the same day arrival or join the extension to Egypt.
