Tour of Israel & Jordan



Day 1 – Thursday, May 20: Depart USA

Depart the USA on your transatlantic flight to Amman, Jordan, with dinner and breakfast served en route.

Day 2 – Friday, May 21: Arrive in Amman, Jordan

Arrive in Amman. Continue to your hotel for dinner and overnight at the Dead Sea.

Day 3 – Saturday, May 22: Mount Nebo, Madaba

Visit Mount Nebo, where Moses caught a glimpse of the Promised Land (Deuteronomy 34). On a clear day, you can see all the way across the Jordan Valley and the Dead Sea, to the rooftops of Jerusalem and Bethlehem. Continue to Madaba, the City of Mosaics, to visit the Church of Saint George, with its sixth-century Byzantine mosaic map of Jerusalem and other holy sites. Overnight at the Dead Sea.

Day 4 – Sunday, May 23: Petra

Travel to the city of Petra. Its entrance passes through a long, narrow gorge known as the Siq and can only be accessed by carriage, horseback, or on foot. Once inside the city, marvel at the intricate detail of a city carved into the cliff sides of rose-colored rock. Overnight at Petra.

Day 5 – Monday, May 24: Wadi Rum, Aqaba

This morning, the group will depart Petra and drive south to the stunning desert of Wadi Rum and Aqaba, a beautiful coastal city in Jordan, at the northern tip of the Red Sea. Overnight at Wadi Rum.



Day 6 – Tuesday, May 25: Cross into Israel, Masada, Ein Gedi, Jaffa

This morning, cross the Arava border. Travel to Masada, Herod's mountaintop fortress, which became the last stronghold of the Jewish revolt against the Romans. Ride the cable car to the top to explore. Peer down upon the remains of the Roman camps and siege ramp. Journey to Ein Gedi and visit the nature preserve and waterfall. Visit the old city of Jaffa, where Simon the Tanner lived and from which Peter set out to bring the gospel to Cornelius (Acts 9, 10). Proceed northward along the coast of the Mediterranean Sea to Netanya for dinner and overnight.



Day 7 – Wednesday, May 26: Caesarea, Mount Carmel, Megiddo, Nazareth Village

Visit Caesarea, a center of the early Christians, where you will visit the Roman aqueduct and theatre. Visit Mount Carmel, where Elijah defeated the Baal prophets, and the monastery at the top of the mountain. Continue to Megiddo (Biblical Armageddon), where 20 different cities lie superimposed upon each other. Explore the Nazareth Village, a living presentation of the life, times, and teachings of Jesus. Overnight in the Galilee.

Day 8 – Thursday, May 27: Mount of Beatitudes, Tel Dan, Caesarea Philippi, Golan Heights, Kursi

Visit the peaceful Mount of Beatitudes. On this hill, Jesus preached the Sermon on the Mount. Visit Tel Dan, where you can see the ancient city gates from the time of Abraham. Travel to Baniyas (Caesarea Philippi), where Peter confessed that Jesus was the Christ. Continue to the Golan Heights for a spectacular view from the Peace Vista of the Sea of Galilee. Return to the Sea of Galilee area to visit Kursi, the likely area where Christ cast the demons into the herd of swine. Overnight in the Galilee.



Day 9 – Friday, May 28: Jesus Boat and Galilee Boat Ride, Capernaum, Peter's Primacy, Arbel Cliffs, Migdal

Begin your morning with a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee. Explore Capernaum, the center of Jesus' ministry in the Galilean region. Visit the synagogue, which stands on

the site where Jesus taught. Recall His teaching and preaching the gospel of the kingdom. Stop at the Chapel of the Primacy, where Peter confessed his devotion to Christ 3 times (John 21). Travel to Mount Arbel and walk along its peak for a stunning view of the Sea of Galilee with extended views of Mount Hermon in the north and Mount Tabor in the south. In Migdal, once home to Mary Magdalene, visit a recently discovered first-century synagogue. Overnight in the Galilee.

Day 10 – Saturday, May 29: Harod Spring, Ahab’s Palace, Beit She’an, Qumran, Mount Scopus overlook.

Visit Harod’s Spring (Ein Harod), where Gideon gathered the army of Israel against the Midianites. Continue on to Ahab’s Palace. Then visit Beit She’an, which has been occupied for over 5,000 years, and view the country’s best preserved Roman amphitheater and other impressive Roman city remains. Proceed to Qumran to view the site where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered and the area that was inhabited by the mysterious community of the Essenes. Have your first view of the Old City of Jerusalem from Mount Scopus. Overnight in the Jerusalem area.

Day 11 – Sunday, May 30: Sorek Valley/Beit Shemesh, Road to Emmaus, Ayalon Valley, Elah Valley, Biblical Gardens at Yad Hashmona

See the Sorek Valley, home of Samson and Delilah. Continue to Beit Shemesh, where the Ark was returned to the Israelites by the Philistines. Walk the Road to Emmaus, where Jesus met two disciples after His resurrection. Journey into the Old Testament as you visit the Valley of Ayalon, where the sun stood still as Joshua defeated the Amorites. Remember David’s victory over Goliath in the Valley of Elah. The last stop will be to learn biblical customs at the Yad Hashmona Biblical Gardens. Overnight in the Jerusalem area.

Day 12 – Monday, May 31: Western Wall, Western Wall Tunnel, Antonia Fortress, Lithostratus, Church of the Holy Sepulchre, Yad Vashem, Bethlehem Fields

Touch a piece of the Temple when you pray at the Western Wall. Visit underground Jerusalem when you walk through the Western Wall Tunnel. Continue to the Lithostratus to see the remains of the Antonia Fortress, where Pilate tried Jesus. Visit the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. Visit Yad Vashem Holocaust Memorial and be touched by its poignant images. Enjoy a view of the Bethlehem Fields. Stay overnight in the Jerusalem area.

Day 13 – Tuesday, June 1: Second Temple Model of Jerusalem, Shrine of the Book, Jewish Quarter, Cardo, Old Wall, Shopping in the Arab Quarter

Visit the Israel Museum to see the Second Temple Model of Jerusalem and the Shrine of the Book, where you can view the Dead Sea Scrolls fragments. Walk the Jewish Quarter and take time to visit the Cardo, a 2,000-year-old market with shops old and new in the Arab Quarter. Overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 14 – Wednesday, June 2: Temple Mount, Pool of Bethesda, Temple Institute, City of David, Hezekiah’s Tunnel, Pool of Siloam, Southern Steps, Davidson Center

Visit the Temple Mount to view the site of the Jewish Temple. Continue to the Pool of Bethesda, where Christ healed the lame man. Visit the Temple Institute to learn of the ordinances and ceremonies of the Temple. Outside of the city walls, visit the City of David, where you see the Gihon Spring, Hezekiah’s Tunnel, and the Pool of Siloam. Visit the Davidson Center and the Southern Wall Excavations, including the Teaching Steps and the Western Wall. Overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 15 – Thursday, June 3: Mount of Olives, Dominus Flevit, Garden of Gethsemane, Caiaphas’ House, David’s Tomb, Upper Room, Garden Tomb

Recount the final hours of Jesus before His crucifixion by walking from the top of the Mount of Olives down to the Garden of Gethsemane, where He prayed and was apprehended. At Dominus Flevit Church, visit the spot where Jesus wept over Jerusalem. See the house of the High Priest Caiaphas, where Christ was imprisoned, and Peter denied Him. See David’s Tomb nearby. On Mount Zion, see the Upper Room where Jesus had a final meal with his disciples. Finally, visit the Garden Tomb, where Christ was buried, and see the empty tomb because He has risen! Overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 16 – Friday, June 4

Return to the USA.

We welcome registrations after 02/15/27. Registrations received after this date will incur an additional fee based on air availability. Additional fees will be advised upon registration.

CANCELLATION FEES:

100% of cancellation fees are covered by the optional Travel Protection Program, provided premium has been paid and reason for cancellation is coverable. All deposit due dates and payment dates are noted on page four of this brochure.
